Brief Summary & Notable Works:

John Andrew Wilhite (b. 31 January, 1991, Richmond, VA, USA) is a performer (double bass, electronics, and more) and composer, based in Oslo, Norway. Their works often contain improvised or "concrete" elements which invite the outside world to interact with composed materials. These works tend to focus on political and ecological questions. John Andrew's work can be seen and heard regularly throughout Scandinavia, Europe, Asia and North America, at festivals and series such as Ultima, Östersjöfestivalen, Sacred Realism, Barents Spektakel, Meteor, Norway Wave, Berlin Jazz Festival and many others.

Rot Society: Co-production with **Black Box Theater (Oslo), The Kitchen (NYC)** and **RAS (Rogaland)**, with **Asamisimasa**. 4 hour long microtonal open score work. Fall 2026.

Carver: Commission from Aparte Festival Fall 2025. For solo double bass

Dialectics of the Deep: Commission from Barents Spektakel (Kirkenes, 2023). "Open work" made from old fishing boats, where the sounds of cod fish are played through the wood of the boats with transducers. The work is "open" because other musicians are invited to interact with the sounds and installation space. Restaged at Festspill i Nord Norge (Harstad, 2023). Workshop version at Tekniska Museum Stockholm as part of Östersjöfestivalen. To be shown on permanent installation at the coming National Cod Museum (Skreimuseet) in Lofoten, from 2026, as well as Nordic Music Days, in Scotland, November 2024. Also shown at Sound Festival in Aberdeen, Scotland, produced by Nordic Music Days.

Dozens of grants from Norwegian Arts Directorate, Music Norway, Nordic Culture Fund, Nordic Culture Point, and other Scandinavian, European, and North American funds. (For extended list, see p.4) **As a performer,** John Andrew Wilhite-Hannisdal is known as a double bassist for work both as a soloist and ensemble player of contemporary music, jazz, and other experimental performance, performing at festivals such as Kongsberg Jazz Festival, Arteacts, Oslo World, and many more.

Wilhite-Hannisdal performs regularly with acclaimed composer and multiinstrumentalist Elliott Sharp (both as duo, in Sharp's SysOrkestra and also in the trio "Life is Like a Tooth" with Marcela Lucatelli), and works in jazz and improvising ensembles such as the Andreas Røysum Ensemble, AUK with Henriette Eilertsen, and in a trio with Chris Cutler and Anja Lauvdal. He has performed at high-profile institutions such as Lincoln Center and The Norwegian National Opera, as well as known underground venues like Studio Acht (Berlin), Kafe Hærverk (Oslo), and Zaal100 (Amsterdam). In Norway, he has also performed at contemporary music festivals such as Ultima (Oslo), Oslo Jazzfestival, Copenhagen Jazzfestival, MINU (Copenhagen), Sildajazz (Haugesund), (and many more), theater festivals such as Meteor (Bergen) and Oslo Internasjonal Teaterfestival, as well as interdisciplinary art festivals such as Barents Spektakel.

John Andrew has toured around Europe and the United States solo and with groups such as Cop Tears and Katt Hernandez/John Andrew duo at respected series and

such as Cop Tears and Katt Hernandez/John Andrew duo at respected series and venues such as Sacred Realism, Berlin Jazz Festival, Moers, Interpenetration, The Ear Inn.

John Andrew Wilhite-Hannisdal has played with classical ensembles such as The Norwegian National Radio Orchestra (KORK), Loft Opera, and Apotheosis Opera. He also performed in experimental opera productions such as Trond Reinholdtsen's The Followers of \emptyset , has worked with contemporary music ensembles like Alpaca Ensemble, and is founding member of the New York based ensemble Cop Tears, who have received significant attention for their projects critiquing and critically engaging with the ideas and music of John Cage and Theodor Adorno. In April 2024 he will appear as a soloist with The Norwegian National Radio Orchestra in the ABYSS bass quartet.
